c) Character and Citizenship Education (CCE)

Servant Leadership Education And Development (SLEAD)

In line with the College's vision, Servant Leadership Education And Development (SLEAD) aims to provide a coherent focus to educating and developing every Saint to be a Servant Leader. A Servant Leader practises 3 key Habits; beginning with the heart that 'desires to serve', followed by the head that 'learns to lead', finally culminating in the hand that 'dares to act'. We believe that these Habits will help instil in our students the four Qualities of a Saint – Exemplary Character, Skilled Communicator, Holistic Thinker, and Community Builder.

Student Leadership

Student leadership development continues to be a key pillar in nurturing Saints to be Servant Leaders Who Bring Life to the Nations. SAJC aspires for each Saint to be a Servant Leader in his or her own capacity, exercising both self-leadership and influence regardless of their position or title both in school and in life.

Over the past year, Saints have stepped up to lead their peers in their classes and CCAs. Our Class and CCA Leaders played a key role in looking out for the wellbeing of their peers and keeping College spirit up through various activities. Building on the envisioning sessions that were conducted in ChrySAlis 2022, our Class Leaders continued to work with their Civics Tutors and Advisors to implement initiatives to build a positive class culture. Our CCA Leaders participated in the annual CCA Leaders Retreat in November 2022, where they shared their experiences as well as their aspirations for their CCAs for the coming year.

SAJC organised the 9th ChrySAlis, our annual Student Leadership Summit, from 30th May to 1st June 2023 for approximately 300 student leaders. The JC1 student leaders from CCAs, Class Executive Committees, Talent Development Programme students, and 40 participants from our affiliated and cluster secondary schools came together in-person to 'Lead The Change'. They were led by a JC2 Student Executive Committee and student facilitators from various Student Leadership CCAs. The Summit provided student leaders with an opportunity to develop as servant leaders who exemplify the quality of a community builder, inspiring one another to make a difference through little acts in their communities.

The SAJC experience would not be complete if not for Saints who stepped forward to lead the College. As student leaders, Student Councillors serve and lead their peers, influencing and rallying them to promote College spirit through various platforms. The 45th Student Council led several College-wide initiatives, such as JC1 Orientation and a senior-junior movie-picnic session in Feb 2023. They also worked hard to rally their peers to build a positive college culture by engaging with the Class Exco and starting a new initiative for Open House 2023 to recruit fellow Saints to support the event as Open House crew. The Councillors were also delighted to lead student supporters to cheer for Team SAJC at selected matches and their passion and enthusiasm inspired the crowd. From January to May 2023, a select group of Councillors participated in a mentoring programme aimed at helping them identify areas for growth and guiding them along in their journey of leadership and self-discovery. They were mentored by alumni who were previously Student Councillors themselves. Based on their newfound leadership and life experiences in university and National Service, the seniors were able to shed light on the concerns and

challenges faced by the Councillors, providing them with a renewed sense of hope and fresh perspectives. Such opportunities provided authentic learning experiences for Student Councillors in their development as Servant Leaders who lead and inspire the student body to love and care for the St Andrew's Family.

Service Learning

The Service Learning (SL) journey at SAJC encourages Saints to grow into passionate Community Builders in a variety of ways: as a common class experience; through CCA involvement; and building on external opportunities as passionate individuals and teams.

Service Learning Days represent a foundational SL experience where Saints engage as a class in the service of our community. Setting aside a day each year for community building provided all students with the time and space to learn as they serve. Classes were matched to their preferences of organisations ranging from Central Singapore CDC to Kwong Wai Shiu Hospital. Whether it was engaging and befriending the elderly or bringing enrichment lessons to underprivileged children, Saints worked hard to touch lives across various segments of society. A key component of these experiences was the interaction with various stakeholders in our society that yielded a greater sense of empathy for hidden communities, such as migrant conservancy and construction workers.

The JC1 and JC2 SL Days were also valuable opportunities to develop leadership abilities. SLEAD Activists from each class were given greater autonomy to learn, facilitate and lead their peers in the development and execution of their projects. Saints were also given the opportunity in 2023 to start their own Saints-Initiated projects with their class. This led to meaningful collaborations with KK Women and Children's Hospital, MINDS (Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore), Willing Hearts and more.

This focus on greater autonomy and leadership in 2023 has inspired Saints-Initiated projects led by passionate individuals and teams. A core group of students initiated the donation drive and mobilised the college community to respond to international humanitarian needs, gathering and packing donations of crisis essentials for Turkiye and Syria in the immediate aftermath of the earthquake, working with United Nations Association Singapore. Other projects included empathy building and advocacy for Special Olympics athletes and showing appreciation to transit workers for SBS Transit Kindness Month. There is no better way to underline the Saint's desire to serve than the dedication and sincerity these students have demonstrated in leading their own SL initiatives.

Saints engaged in community building with their CCAs as well. Both Saints Advocate and Interact Club sustained community service with Metropolitan YMCA (MYMCA) and Lions Befrienders, continuing their commitment to service by combining their efforts. The Environment Club also expanded their service from sustainability issues to creating a caring commuter culture with the Public Transport Council. Mentoring Club sustained their valuable work with St Andrew's Junior School, guiding primary school students in academic and socio-emotional growth. The SAJC Choir brought joy to the elderly of Kwong Wai Shiu Hospital with a lively Christmas carolling session. These acts of service leverage on the specialised skills of CCA groups to amplify our impact on the community, reinforcing the message that the journey of growing as servant leaders runs through every aspect of the SAJC experience. In June 2023, Saints Advocate resumed Overseas Service Learning Projects (OSLP) with a trip to serve at an orphanage in Bintan, Indonesia. An OSLP to Chiangmai, Thailand would follow in Dec 2023. We value these regional projects that are now possible once again, as they reflect the vision to develop servant leaders that would bring life to the nations, with an emphasis on growing the awareness, capability and heart to extend our goodwill to communities beyond our borders, and the humility to learn from this privilege to serve.

Lastly, the Service Learning Convention (SLC) has evolved to link many of these threads together, underlining a culture of community building. Held on 4 May 2023, the SLC provided a student-led platform for JC2 Activists to share their experience and leadership approaches with the JC1 Activists, passing on the skills and insights to mobilise fellow Saints to serve the community. Student leaders from Saints Advocate organised a Service Learning exhibition that showcased a range of service learning experiences. They also designed a facilitation workshop to empower Activists with key skills in creating inclusive dialogue about community and service. The convention strengthened a sense of collective commitment and continuity in the Saints community-building ethos, and symbolised the completion of a virtuous circle for Activists – where they were once inspired by their seniors, they now inspire others.

The focus on student autonomy has empowered Saints to learn and serve with sincerity and passion. As Saints continue to demonstrate our commitment to community and service, we also grow together in empathy, care and the can-do spirit that Saints will carry with them beyond college and into the wider world.

Citizenship Education

Over the past two years, our College has experienced a significant revitalisation of Citizenship Education programmes, which have infused our institution with new energy and brought about meaningful moments of learning and celebration.

In July 2022, the College commemorated Racial Harmony Day through a series of activities aimed at fostering appreciation for the diverse ethnic and cultural tapestry that forms the vibrant Singapore society. The JC1 students were treated to a special Bhangra Dance troupe performance, celebrating Singapore's rich cultural diversity known as the "Cultural Mosaic." Meanwhile, the JC2 students engaged in an enlightening panel discussion with the Ministry of Funny's YouTube content creators, Haresh Tilani and Terence Chia, who shared their experiences in using comedy and satire to initiate conversations on the sensitive topics of casual racism and xenophobia in Singapore. Through these activities, our students learned the valuable lesson that Singapore's racial harmony should never be taken for granted, and that each of us can contribute to this ongoing work.

Our JC2 students also had the privilege of engaging in a dialogue with Dr. Amy Khor, the Senior Minister of State for Sustainability and the Environment, as part of the SG Perspectives dialogue sessions. They discussed various environmental issues, including the adoption of electric vehicles, concerns about climate change, and the role of youth in advocating for environmental causes. This dialogue provided our students with a better understanding of the critical role each of us plays in sustaining our environment.

On 8th August 2022, we celebrated National Day by collaborating with the Central Singapore Community Development Council (CSCDC). Our JC2 students took to the streets to spread the message of hope that "Saints can be Giraffes and stick their necks out for the common good, and so can you!" We were honoured to have CSCDC Mayor Denise Phua grace our National Day Observance ceremony before our students embarked on their mission to promote volunteering. Additionally, our JC1 students commemorated National Day by serving others through their respective class Service Learning projects. They engaged with the elderly at NTUC Health Senior Day Care and participated in enrichment activities with vulnerable children at CSCDC's 'Junior Stars' Nurture Workshops.

Total Defence Day, observed every year on 15 February to remember the fall of Singapore during World War II, focused on the importance of military defence. Given the ongoing war between Russia and Ukraine, this commemoration held particular significance. This year, our JC2 students engaged in a dialogue with representatives from MINDEF, including COL Darren Tan. Additionally, the entire College enjoyed a Total Defence carnival at the end of Term 1, where the 8th Singapore Infantry Regiment showcased their military arsenal, including weapons displays, "robo-dog" capabilities, and a fitness challenge station. These activities raised awareness about the fact that every Singaporean has a role to play in Total Defence.

In April 2023, we joyously celebrated International Friendship Day by staging musical performances representing the various cultures during the JC1 Assembly. The JC2s also engaged with the President of the United Nations Association of Singapore, Mr Alexander Charles Louis and learned how we in Singapore can assist other countries, through efforts like the SAJC donation drive for victims of the Syria-Turkiye earthquake. Through these activities, our students deepened their understanding of international friendship and reflected on how they can play a part in keeping Singapore relevant in a changing global landscape.

Environmental Initiatives

There were many initiatives to promote environmental stewardship among staff and students within the College and in the community. SAJC has collaborated with agencies such as the National Environment Agency, Public Utilities Board and National Parks. Some of the projects included upcycling of empty plastic bottles into self-watering gardening pots, allowing more students to grow plants in their homes. In addition, we participated in World Water Day 2023 where Environment Club members conducted a small-scale water rationing exercise within our College. They also created e-posters and rallied their peers to raise their awareness on water conservation. In addition, the Environment Club participated in the LTA Ambassador Programme, known as the 'TAP Car-Lite Challenge', creating a proposal to encourage a car-lite culture in Singapore. Overall, due to consistent efforts in promoting environmental awareness within and outside the college, the Environment Club was awarded the Kopsia Award for Singapore Green Schools in 2022.
